CareFirst BlueCross/BlueShield Sponshorship Opportunity

In the last newsletter, I had an article regarding the possibility of obtaining grant money from CareFirst BlueCross/Blue Shield for the Association to further its goals of promoting country-western dance in the Northern Virginia community. CareFirst offers this grant money to promote its own health initiatives through partnering with area organizations with related goals. In the radio advertisement that triggered the Board's interest, CareFirst enumerated the health benefits of dance, and it seemed that there might be a good chance of the Association obtaining funds.

After contacting CareFirst regarding the requirements, it became clear that the time that would be needed to complete the in-depth application process was extensive. The Board decided that it would be best to check with CareFirst again to see what the chance of success would be before proceeding. I again contacted CareFirst and was told that the chances were remote. The Board then decided not to pursue the matter further.

Several people I have spoken with have suggested that this may have been a simple way for CareFirst to cut down on applicants. If anyone has the time or interest to pursue this any further, please email me or my husband, Marty Johnson, at membership@nvcwda.org.

A Note from the Dance Director

Alas, another summer has come and gone. Hopefully, all your summer activities and vacations were safe, successful, and enjoyable. For those of you who have taken a "summer sabbatical" from our dances to enjoy the activities, let me be the first to welcome you back. We've missed you.

Thanks to the continued hard work on advertising by our previous Vice President (and now our President), Charlie Pierce, and our membership director, Marty Johnson (and Karen), the attendance at our dances has held pretty steady over the summer months, and we have seen a lot of new faces—both great developments. So, with the new folks in mind, I'd like to share a few thoughts.

Do you remember when you were brand new to country western dancing? Your dance "repetoire" may have consisted of some basic Two Step and maybe some knowledge of a "grapevine" or "shuffle" step—if that. Do you remember the apprehension and perhaps the stark fear when someone "more experienced" asked you to dance? Do you remember the mental "overload" as you tried to learn all the line dances in a single night (but only succeeded in getting them all jumbled together in your mind)?

Yes, we were all beginners once, and probably still have some mental "scars" from the experience. So, be "gentle" with our new dancers. Try not to inundate them with dozens of dances or couples dance moves—until and unless they are ready. Everyone learns at a different rate and by different means. Some are entirely comfortable with getting on the floor and "following" the crowd right off the bat—no matter how awkward they may feel or look. Others may learn by watching from the "sidelines" and "chair dancing" before they are ready to hit the floor. Finally, others may need to take formal lessons before they feel comfortable enough to "go out in public."

So...respect the "needs" and abilities of our new dancers. Be there when they need and want some help. But...teach them the dances CORRECTLY! Most people tend to retain what they learn first—even if it is wrong. If you don't know the dances well enough to teach them correctly, please don't volunteer to help—simply refer them to a more "seasoned" dancer. In the end, our new dancers will thank you for your humility and good judgment. Remember, it's not about impressing them with how much you know (or think you know). It's about ensuring our new dancers get a firm foundation on which to build their country western dancing abilities around.

As always, see you on the dance floor!

Cabo San Lucas Step Sheet

Choreographed by Rep Ghazali

Description: 32 count, 4 wall, beginner line dance

Music: Cabo San Lucas by Toby Keith (CD: That Don't Make Me A Bad Guy / Available on ITunes)

Start dancing on lyrics

LEFT CROSS ROCK-RECOVER, SIDE SHUFFLE, RIGHT CROSS ROCK-RECOVER, 1/4 TURN SHUFFLE

- 1-2 Cross/rock left over right, recover on right
- 3&4 Step left to side, step right together, step left to side
- 5-6 Cross/rock right over left, recover on left
- 7&8 Turn 1/4 right and step right forward, step left together, step right forward

STEP-1/2 PIVOT, ROCKING CHAIR, SHUFFLE FORWARD LEFT

- 1-2 Step left forward, turn 1/2 right (weight to right)
- 3-4 Rock left forward, recover on right
- 5-6 Rock left back, recover on right
- 7&8 Step left forward, step right together, step left forward

RIGHT ROCK FORWARD-RECOVER, SHUFFLE 1/2 TURN, SKATE LEFT-RIGHT, SHUFFLE FORWARD

- 1-2 Rock right forward, recover on left
- 3&4 Turn 1/2 right and step right forward, step left together, step right forward
- 5-6 Skate left, skate right
- 7&8 Step left forward, step right together, step left forward

STEP-1/2 PIVOT, SHUFFLE FORWARD, CROSS-BACK, SWAY-SWAY

- 1-2 Step right forward, turn 1/2 left (weight to left)
- 3&4 Step right forward, step left together, step right forward
- 5-6 Cross left over right, step right back
- 7-8 Sway left, sway right

REPEAT

Cherry Hill, Fr. the Capital Beltway, take Exit 25 (US Route 1 South). Take first right onto Cherry Hill Road and go 1 mile to Cherry Hill Park and Camp Grounds. Entrance on the left. Follow entrance road to back of the park, make a right turn at the 3rd STOP sign. Center is on left just past swimming pool. Parking is free. http://www.dance-info.com/
